In 1956, Jimmy Roberts, a mountaineer give this nickname to Tharpu Chuli Peak. Climbing Tharpu Chuli Peak is easier than climbing the famous peaks like Mera Peak or Island Peak. The non-technical route yet adventurous experience makes Tharpu Chuli Peak one of the best peaks to climb for novice climbers.

Tharpu Chuli Peak Climbing will let you explore the wonderful beauty of the Annapurna region. As the trail passes through fine villages resided by people from various communities, you will get to observe a unique blend of culture and tradition. Likewise, you will also see many stupas, temples, prayer wheels, and colorful prayer flags throughout the trail. Moreover, the trail involves several dense forests of rhododendron and oak, meadows, and terraced fields. Tharpu Chuli Peak Climbing allows you to see many vegetation and diverse topography in just a matter of a few days.

During Tharpu Chuli Peak Climbing, you get to witness panoramic views of numerous

Himalayan mountains like Annapurna range (8,091 m), Mt. Machhapuchhre (6,993 m), Mt. Fang (7,647 m), Mt. Hiunchuli (6,441 m), Mt. Gangapurna (7,455 m), Fluted Peak (4,131 m), etc. The entire trail is decorated with snow-capped mountaintians, moraines, and stunning glaciers. As the trail will gain altitude, you will find yourself amidst unspoiled and gorgeous nature.

Tharpu Chuli Peak Climbing leads you to picturesque Ghorepani village and ascend to Poon Hill from where you get to see tempting sunrise.
